Background

According to the United Nations, more than 700 million people or 10 per cent of the world population, still live in extreme poverty today. These disadvantaged people are struggling to fulfil the most basic needs like health, education, and access to water and sanitation, to name a few. For the people who are doing a job cannot guarantee a peaceful living. As per research findings, the UN also reports that eight percent of the employed workers and their families worldwide lived in extreme poverty in 2018. One out of five children live in extreme poverty. Ensuring social protection for all children and other vulnerable groups is critical to reduce poverty.

Poverty reduction initiatives and activities of the Government of Bangladesh has been commendable in the recent years. The Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs) 2020 reports that by 2016, extreme poverty stood at 12.9 per cent while the overall poverty headcount reached 24.3 per cent. The government is firmly committed to liberate its people from the vulnerable situation of poverty. It is very impressive to learn that the recent perspective Plan 2021-2041 and the Five-Year Plan (2021-2025) consider poverty reduction as a major target for transforming Bangladesh into a high-income country by 2041.

As a young higher education institution, the mission and vision of Daffodil International University (DIU) support working for the society as part of the national development. The founder and the Chairman of Board of Trustees of DIU Dr. Md Sabur Khan, has a long history to server the need people in the society. He has created a substantial fund for poverty alleviation where the recipient does not have a return the money or any portion of it to the doner, he/she will utilize the money as self-employment manner for livelihood of their family. This model has earned tremendous success because of its novelty and acceptance in the community.

The project was implemented at a rural village Baburhat located in the peripheral district Chandpur. Details of this poverty alleviation project are presented below.

Project Information

Poverty actually creates relative sensitive emotions that are regarded as a curse of a nation. Poor people could not find out straw to come out from this curse. The Almighty Allah has dictated in the holy book regarding the strategy of poverty reduction through Zakat. Center for Zakat Management (CZM) is a pioneer organization that manages the zakat in an institutionalized way with a view to reducing poverty and hunger from Bangladesh. CZM works with the mobilization and proper distribution of Zakat in an organized and planned manner by setting up different projects in Bangladesh and has managed to change the lives of many individuals and families. In continuation to this effort, CZM, with support of Daffodil Foundation (Daffodil Foundation is run with the financial assistance of Daffodil International University), has been implementing another project at Baburhat in Chandpur district. The aim of the project is to sustainable reduction of poverty and hunger through creating self-employment as well as self-motivated entrepreneurs in the selected area for cumulative and sustainable development in Chandpur, a district of Bangladesh. Daffodil International University also supported the first phase of the project with CZM which ended in 2018.

At the initial stage, there were huge gathering of the local people, local government representatives, community leaders, donors and the Education Minister of the government. The beneficiaries were also present in the event to receive their cheques. The photo witnesses the excitement of the people.

For perfectly managing the GRO, the project formed 17 executive committees. The committee is formed on the basis of the consent of all the members.

Investment in Income Generating Activities

On the basis of skills and experience, the beneficiaries took the investment money from GRO. The fund that is transferred to the GROs is used as revolving fund. Members devise plan for investment in group meeting. Areas and amount of investment are determined considering members' ability, experience, market for



produced items etc. If necessary, members are provided training on Income Generating Activities. A few photos are given below of these activities.



Till January 2021, total 1000 recipient families have received investment from the GRO and the total amount of investment was BDT 1,37,90,000. The investment information is mentioned below.

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Child Education



Ensuring quality education is important component of sustainable livelihood development. The project provides pre-primary education to the children (5/6 years) for proper childhood development and make them capable to admit in Primary education. It provides basic knowledge of morality and ensure proper nutrition for them. Awareness raising on different issues propels to acclimatize the beneficiaries with civilized world. For this reason, BCC (Behavioral Change Communication) session has been done in the community.

Conclusion:

The Jeebika-Baburhat project-II, being implemented by the Center for Zakat Management with the sponsorship and assistance from Daffodil Foundation and Daffodil International University, aimed at poverty alleviation and reducing hunger through creating self-employment among the selected poor families at Chandpur District of Bangladesh. The project has been successful in terms of selfemployment, enhancing literacy rate & sanitation, reducing child and mother mortality rate etc.

Till to date primarily 1500 beneficiaries have started various small businesses for ensuring a sustainable livelihood for their families from the Jeebika-Baburhat project in the first two phases. About 100 percent literacy rate and sanitation have also been implemented among the selected families in selected area under the project.

The project developed a strategy in such a way so that no one should be dependent in the long run and they can lead their life without any financial help

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from others. They will be fully free from interest-based loans and able to educate their children to be successful in their life. This project's outcome and success would encourage and facilitate other capable people of the society to replicate this strategy to change the fate of the poor people and the country in the long run. This strategy can also be practiced elsewhere in the world as a best practice approach to meet the global SDGs on no poverty and zero hunger. The Jeebika-Chandpur project phase III is going to be started soon with the same goals and targets.
